

## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – FOI 669**

### Question:

Under the Freedom of Information Act, can I have copies of everything held by the PCC, office & staff, including email, reports and notes, both hard copy and digital, that relates to the IOD pension reviews being carried out and now being stopped from this year.

### Answer:

Subject headings of weekly meeting items between the PCC and Chief Constable are published on the PCC's website. Therefore there is no obligation for the PCC's office to supply this information. The exemption applicable to this information is Section 21: Information reasonably accessible by other means. This is an absolute and class based exemption and as such does not require a harm and public interest test.

Apart from the published information, as stated above, the information that you have requested is not recorded. Please note that the scope of the Freedom of Information Act is limited to recorded information held at the time of the request. There is no requirement on an organisation to create new information in response to a request. Therefore, this letter represents a Refusal Notice.

To reiterate the FOI response to you on 13 April 2017 (FOI663):

The PCC has regular meetings with the Chief Constable, discussing a number of matters. However, no information is held of the dates and venues as well as what was said regarding the specific subject of Injury on Duty Pension reviews over the last two years.
