

## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – FOI 690**

### Question:

I understand that following an email exchange on the 20th of February 2017 between the CC Andrew Marsh and the PCC Sue Mountstevens, that they had a meeting about Injury On Duty Police Pensioners & the Pension Reviews. Can I have copies of any minutes taken, original rough notes, briefing documents or anything else used for this briefing and the date it was held and details of who was present.

### Answer:

Following an email exchange on 20 February 2017 between Chief Constable Andy Marsh and PCC Sue Mountstevens, there is no information held regarding copies of any minutes taken, original rough notes, briefing documents or anything else used for this meeting between the Chief Constable and PCC. Apart from the published information, as stated above, the information that you have requested is not recorded. Please note that the scope of the Freedom of Information Act is limited to recorded information held at the time of the request. There is no requirement on an organisation to create new information in response to a request. Therefore, this letter represents a Refusal Notice.

To reiterate the FOI response to you on 23 June 2017 (FOI669) and on 13 April 2017 (FOI663):

The PCC has regular meetings with the Chief Constable, discussing a number of matters. However, no information is held of the dates and venues as well as what was said regarding the specific subject of Injury on Duty Pension reviews over the last two years.

To assist you with your request for information, there are regular meetings between the Chief Constable and PCC on a number of subject headings. However, these are verbal updates only.
