## RE: FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST - FOI820 - CON-027936

Avon and Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner's (PCC's) office have now completed the search for the information which you requested on the 9<sup>th</sup> July2020.

## Your request:

1. A copy of the audio recording from a specific Avon and Somerset Police Appeal Tribunal.

## Our response:

Whilst we appreciate your involvement in this case, being the complainant. Together with the fact this was an open hearing, available to the public to attend. This does not give you an automatic right to the audio recording. Had you attended in person and been privy to the proceedings, this would still not entitle you to a copy.

Disclosures made under the Freedom of Information Act, are essentially disclosures to the general public, and we therefore are unable to consider your personal reasons for requesting the information. We need to consider the consequences of the wider dissemination of the requested information.

Under the legislation, the audio relates to an appeal hearing for an identifiable officer, therefore the information constitutes personal information.

The exemption applicable to the information is Section 40 (2), personal information, which is an Absolute exemption. Any information to which a request relates is exempt if it constitutes personal data of which the applicant is the data subject or not the data subject and if disclosure of that information to a member of the public would contravene any of the principles set out in:

(a) Article 5(1) of the GDPR, and

(b) Section 34(1) of the Data Protection Act 2018;

Personal data shall be processed fairly and lawfully and only obtained for one or more specified purpose or purposes.

The facts of this case have been made public, and therefore the actions taken by the Constabulary are transparent. There is no further public benefit in disclosure of the audio that would outweigh the rights afforded to the subject of the information under GDPR/DPA.
