Notes of Bristol City Council Mayor/PCC meeting

16th January 2019 - 16.30 - 17.30

- 1) Update on budget PCC planning a £24 increase on precept Constabulary will recruit net 100 extra officers and work on drugs, burglary and knife crime. Council budget to be published this week; no new savings proposals MTFP from last year still valid; plan to increase precept by 4% which is maximum range of views reasonable level of support. However still a number of pressures on the budget for both organisations.
- Police & Crime Plan and Performance demand has stabilised, outcomes are improving, recruitment ongoing, Op Remedy, Office of Data Analytics.
- 3) Enquiry Day Action Plan Bijan Ebrahimi the BCC investigation is now complete no disciplinary action will be taken. An update on multi agency activity was provided AB has been leading on Multi Agency Action Plan Safer Bristol have provided governance aim for a joint briefing with family AB to liaise with MJ about timing. Plan update on multi agency to come to next SB meeting. Also need to let comms team know.

Action -

4) Bristol Race Relations, use of police powers and community engagement, Lammy – It was felt the Broadmead joint working had been successful. MR and SM will do a public walk about at Broadmead. AB planning a dedicated beat manager. AC has liaised with and BID.

Action - AB to arrange a joint visit to Broadmead area to see the improvements.

5) Bristol Youth Violence – AC organised a follow up event about gang violence with the community.

Actions: - AC to provide findings of that session to this group

- AB is organising quarterly community meetings.
- Gang strategy Asher wants to work with AB on updating the existing BCC strategy into a joint strategy by the summer.
- 6) Reducing Reoffending Board BCC have lost confidence in Wick House concerned that prison/probation continue to refer there.

Action: JS to follow up with Reducing Reoffending Board

7) AOB

One City Plan – had been well received including Serious Violence and knife crime priority.

Security/safety incidents – MR and AC described the worrying incidents that had happened to them. AB described there was a general review for high profile politicians in city. MR thanked for efficient and supportive response from the police. SC referred to Op Bridger and work with local MPs - expand that to cover high profile people.

Action: SC will send MJ details about plans for Op Bridger.

Action: ASC will update on Brexit plans.

Serious violence - SC has been doing mapping - at least 10 key projects related to SV; need to get governance sorted; come to health and wellbeing board to drive this work.

Action: SC/JS to follow up with _____ re Serious Violence Board. Empower board to deliver – agreed won't be led by police. Note H and WB - may be more focused on Bristol, North Somerset and South Glos with BNSSG CCG.

Action - follow up Brexit meeting in March — police will provide updated briefing for March meeting and any specific briefings to MR.
