## **RE: FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – FOI940 33709**

Avon and Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner's (PCC's) office have now completed the search for the information which you requested on the 25<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

## **Your request:**

Per the Freedom of information Act. Please provide me with the information contained in your records as follows:

Please supply all holdings of up-to-date surety fiduciary bonds, for quality assurance for the rights and perusal of the members of the public you serve?

## Our response:

No information held.

We have been guided by advice provided by the National Police Chiefs Council (NPCC), National Police FOI & DP Central Referral Unit (NPFDU) in relation to this request, which is as follows:

'Initial checks reveal that forces and OPCCs will not hold information relevant to this request. According to open source information, a fiduciary is someone, or entity placed in a position of trust over the financial affairs of another. A surety bond therefore, is put in place to prevent the fiduciary from abusing that position of trust, such as committing fraud for example.

In short, the majority of police force expenditure may well originate from the public purse, but forces are not a trustee of the financial affairs of the public. No such bond is necessary.'
