### **Become a PCC Volunteer**

The role of the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) is to review. improve and scrutinise policing practices. To help us do this, we work with local people as volunteers.

This means we can get their independent views and feedback on a range of policing issues. We do this through participation in one of four areas, looking at different aspects of police work.

We are looking for people of all backgrounds, ages, and experience across the Avon and Somerset area to volunteer with us and act as independent parties. We particularly encourage applications from people under 30, women and people from Black, Asian, mixed and minoritised communities.



### An overview of our panels

#### **ISOPP** Panel Independent Scrutiny of Police Powers

This panel meets quarterly to review police Use of Force. These meetings include reviewing police bodycam footage and commenting on the appropriate Use of Force and stop and search.

#### **ISOPC** Panel

#### Independent Scrutiny of Police Complaints

This panel reviews complaints made to the police by members of the public, assessing them for efficiency, fairness, transparency and service to communities.





#### **ICVs**

#### Independent Custody Visitors

Volunteers visit police stations in pairs at times to suit them. These unannounced visits involve checking on the welfare of people detained in custody by the police to see the conditions in which they are being held, ensure their rights are being observed and will involve speaking to detainees accompanied by a police custody officer. The scheme covers the custody units in Bridgwater, Keynsham and Patchway.

#### **OOCD** Panel

Out of Court Disposals

Out of Court Disposals are a way for the police to deal with less serious offending. This panel includes members of the Criminal Justice System and victim support services. The panel meets quarterly to review whether decisions were proportionate, timely, victim-focused and rehabilitative.



#### How to apply
